



Mercer Linear Series Stair Tread Maintenance

Maintenance for Mercer Linear Series Vinyl (Type TV) and Rubber (Type TP) Stair Treads Including:

- Maxxi Tread Rubber (Type TP)
- Visually Impaired Safety Treads Vinyl (Type TV) and Rubber (TP)
- Commercial 250 Heavy Traffic Stair Treads Vinyl (Type TV) & Rubber (TP)
- Commercial 210 Normal Traffic Stair Treads Vinyl (Type TV)
- Commercial 150 Light Traffic Stair Treads Vinyl (Type TV)

Mercer's Linear Series Stair Treads by Burke Flooring, normally requires very little maintenance. Due to its refined and integral surface, it maintains its natural satin finish with very little maintenance.

Regular Cleaning:

For routine cleaning, wipe treads with a damp cloth. This will usually be sufficient to restore the tread's finish and appearance. For tougher jobs, a deck brush or scrub brush and a neutral detergent will clean off most grime and scuffs. For larger installations, a small rotary scrubber specially made for stair treads is recommended. Call you local janitorial supply house for various options.

Scuff Removal:

Shoe sole marks, marks from cleaning equipment and other rolling stock can be unsightly and require removal. Most such marks can be removed with a mildly abrasive cleaner such as Soft Scrub. Abrasive cleaners like Comet are not recommended.

Wax Removal:

Waxing Linear Series Stair Treads is not recommended. It is not required and it normally adds to the overall maintenance cost of the product. If the stair treads are accidentally waxed, and if this is unsightly or unobjectionable, the wax can be removed. A gentle hand application of a neutral pH wax remover is most effective. Be careful not to over strip the surface which could cause color variation that would be more noticeable than the discoloration of the wax.
